Differentiated Instruction

- Adjustments to the curriculum are made based on individual student need to provide access to the core curriculum
- Content, Process & Product are adjusted to reach and teach each learner
- Curriculum is extended, modified, or accommodated based on the ability level of the student.
- Access to hands on learning, project based learning, constructivist techniques, direct instruction, and a variety of research based methods
- GATE strategies are used in every class -Depth and Complexity techniques, open ceiling and extension activities
